In November 2022 on Thanksgiving Day, we celebrate with the church giving thanks to God with food and testimonies! where we were blessed.

We also give away 2 turkeys for Thanksgiving dinner to the people on the bridge, that is, to the homeless, showing their gratitude!



Shawnee Nazarene Academy was birthed in 2021 through a group of educators and interested parents. SNA complements the previously existing preschool ministry through Adventure Time Preschool and provides a choice for parents to continue their child's education through the ministry of Shawnee Church of the Nazarene programs. The Lord has continued to bless our school in the 2022–2023 school year. Beginning the school year with more than double the enrollment of our first year, SNA was able to launch a homeschool enrichment program giving families in the community an opportunity to participate at the school one day a week. We have seen growth not just in numbers, but in spiritual development and quality of academics as well. SNA was able to complement our church's quizzing program by offering curriculum through our Bible classes and inviting school-aged children to join the quiz team at the church. We take seriously our role in developing well-educated future leaders for the Kingdom.

Adventure Time Preschool is an outreach ministry of Shawnee Church of the Nazarene. ATPS has served the community for 49 years. This is my third year as Director of Adventure Time, and my 22nd year on staff at the preschool. ATPS is blessed with a wonderful group of teachers who are committed to the children and families of Adventure Time Preschool. This group includes Amy Gonzales, Becky Boulware, Cat Johnson, Courtney Schafersman, Dar Hartshorn, Kim Turner, Mollie Michael, and Ruth Schick. They are loving and caring people who help to make ATPS a special place for the children, and I would like to express my great appreciation for each of them.

- Liaison with Miller Management
- Facility scheduling and managing (keys, etc)
- Marketing of SNA, ATPS, and SCN
- Background Check and Ministry Safe administration and delegation with the security team
- Board Meeting Prep and follow-up
- Community Connections: ways the church/SNA/ATPS can serve outside of the church.

I have helped analyze routines and structure that was in place and find ways to help them become more efficient and effective with the help of collaborating with staff and board members. I have started brainstorming and executing meetings with the people needed to prepare for all church events, safety, facility, technology changes, and more. All of these have helped us get into better planning and communication routines.

Whitney has been on staff since October 2021.

- Facility maintenance bids, execution, and payments (with the help of the trustees)

- Updated membership role in Planning Center
- Refinance: helped gather data and information to fill out forms. Transferred all utilities, and more
- ERC CARES ACT: helped gather data and information for Lon Dagley to implement
- Policies: help design, gain approval, and implement
- Taught art for SNA once a week
- Taught chapel for several weeks in the fall: Fruit of the Spirit each week
- Helped SNA with a Food Pantry field trip
- SNA Apparel (ordering, vinyl imprinting, and managing stock)

- Free up more time to be more available, by creating strategic partnerships to delegate work (save us money in the long run)
- Creating more of a connection with the ministries of the church to help us delegate and work together more efficiently to help further our ministries
- Find more people who have the desire to serve and help plug them in areas to be more connected and loved within the church
- Continue to communicate and work ahead of schedule on planning all church events and goals, so we have more teamwork and delegating
- Create more efficiency in facility use and maintenance
- Make more community connections for our ministries
- Help brainstorm communication and direction for purposes of events and ministries and follow-up
- How to work more with the stewards to make sure communication of our laypeople is heard and followed-up in a timely manner

The members of the congregation of this local church gives of their resources generously for the support of pastoral staff, missions and funding of local ministries. I am inspired by the giving of resources by our people both in the past and the present. Because of this, it is a privilege to serve as Treasurer to this local church. It is my intention to meet the requirements of the Manual of the Church of the Nazarene "...to cause careful accounting to be kept of all money received and disbursed by the church...". The purpose of this report is to share highlights from the year.



Terry has served as the church treasurer since

- Overall
 - The Shawnee Church will end the year in a sound financial position. Expenses were held within budget. All district and general obligations were covered. Reserves are adequate to meet normal variations in income and expenses.
- ATPS & SNA are Self-Sufficient
 - Both schools, Adventure Time Preschool (ATPS) and Shawnee Nazarene Academy (SNA), are self-sufficient, budgeting and covering their direct costs each month through their revenue streams. Both ATPS and SNA maintain adequate financial reserves. Each also contributes to the use of the facility on a monthly basis.
- Challenges
 - Tithes and Offerings are down after 10 months by about \$29K (5%) so far, but expenses for Church Operations remain within the plan. Church Operations reserves were reduced in the previous fiscal year but remain stable and adequate to support routine operations.
 - Expensive repairs were funded this year, such as the rebuilding of the soffits (\$30k) and several plumbing repairs (\$11k). Going forward, a significant challenge will be to fund future capital repairs such as the resurfacing of the parking lot and the updating of the HVAC systems. It will be a challenge to the Finance Planning Team, the Trustees, and the Church Board to plan and budget for these future needs.

- Two Major Goals Achieved
 - 1. Refinancing
 - The refinancing of the \$1.5 million mortgage was timely and of financial benefit. The previous loan maturity date was in October 2024. However, early in 2022, the Trustees and the Church Board agreed to pursue an early refinancing in order to lock in a lower interest rate rather than "wait and see" what we might get in 2024. The new loan was effective November 1, 2022. The rate was improved from about 5.5% to 4.25%. This reduced the monthly mortgage payment during a time of very tight budget. Special thanks are due to Whitney Means, Lon Dagley, Pastor Cara, and Pastor Chuck for helping with the tedious process of refinancing.
 - o 2. Debt Retirement Plan
 - The Finance Planning Team proposed a debt retirement plan to the Trustees that would retire the indebtedness in 10 years. The Trustees have approved the plan and have begun executing against it. It is exciting to look ahead to being debt free.

ELEMENTS OF THE DEBT REDUCTION PLAN

- 1. Monthly Payment of Extra Principal
 - Since the refinancing resulted in a lower interest rate, the monthly mortgage
 payment was also reduced. A portion of that reduction in monthly payment has
 been redirected and budgeted to pay extra principal every month going forward.
 Also, ATPS and SNA are contributing a "building use fee" monthly which will be
 applied as extra principal. The total amount of extra principal each month will be
 \$3625.

2. Bold Vision Bold Faith Fund

 This fund is used to accrue donations intended to reduce indebtedness. Over \$25,000 had been accumulated through generous contributions over the past few years and has been applied to extra principal payments this year. As faithful contributions continue to accumulate they will be applied to the reduction of debt.

• 3. Building Use Fees

- Those accumulated previously by ATPS and SNA in the prior fiscal year have been applied to the new loan in the form of extra principal payments.
- 4. Debt Reduction Fundraising Campaign
 - The fourth element of the plan is a 3-year fundraising effort to raise approximately \$300k to apply to the loan against the principal. The team is excited to engage the congregation in this effort on the journey to the elimination of debt. Plans will be shared during the next fiscal year.

• By June 1, 2023, the amount paid in extra principal will total \$62,000 in this fiscal year alone! This is an exciting start to a 10-year debt retirement plan. While this goal will require us to stretch as a congregation, with commitment and persistence, it is within reach.

• Balance is needed.

 This Debt Retirement Plan is just one part of the long-term plan under development by the Trustees as we move into a new fiscal year. Resources will be needed to fund the expansion of ministries as well as facility maintenance. This will require a balance of allocation between, ministry needs, facility needs, and debt retirement.
 We are off to a good start.

It is a privilege to serve in the role of Treasurer in support of the building of God's Kingdom. I am grateful for the opportunity to be a part of His plan during these exciting times. Great things are ahead.
